Back-to-Back

Discussion Movement

Purpose:

To allow students to review material learned in class.

Description:

Students stand or sit back-to-back with a partner. The teacher will ask a question about the lesson or topic.

When the teacher says, "face-to-face," students turn to face each other and discuss the question.

When they are done, they will turn back-to-back again to indicate they are finished.

The teacher will use <u>Pick-a-Stick</u> or another non-voluntary strategy to have students share answers.

SEL Skills: Working memory, impulse control, collaboration, communication, attention, self-regulation

Cultural Behaviors: Kinesthetic, subjectivity, interpersonal, dynamic attention span
